



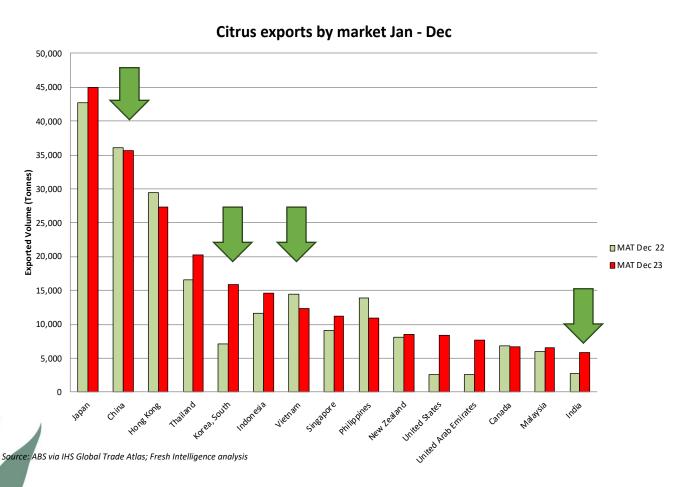

Citrus Exports by Market 2023



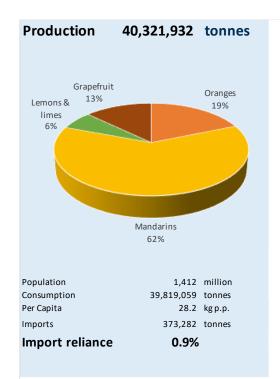

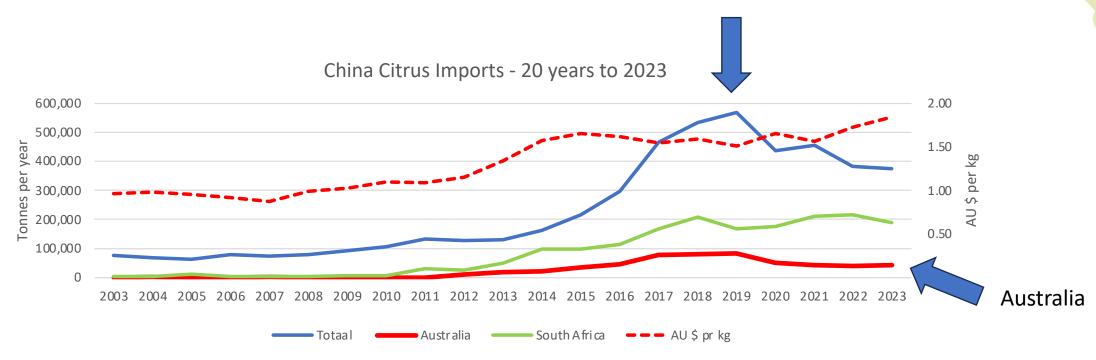

Only 1% reliant on imports
Imports are trending down 10 per cent per year
- though 2% lower from Southern Hemisphere
72 per cent from Southern Hemisphere
11 per cent from Australia

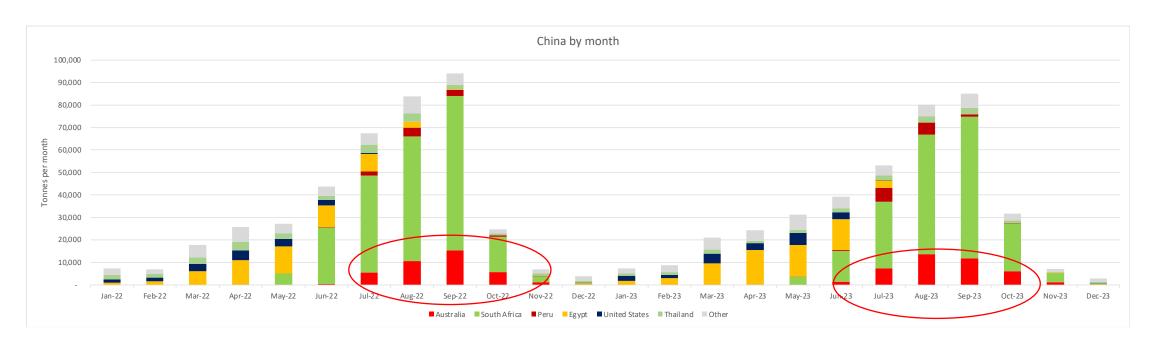


US imports are decreasing thus driving overall imports lower COVID 19 impacts since 2020 South Africa is the largest southern supplier followed by Australia Unit values are increasing





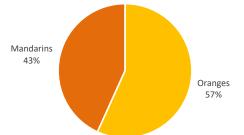
China - Seasonal citrus imports by supplier





Australia supplied 57% oranges and 43% mandarins in 2023 Egyptian citrus may have difficulty accessing the China market in 2024

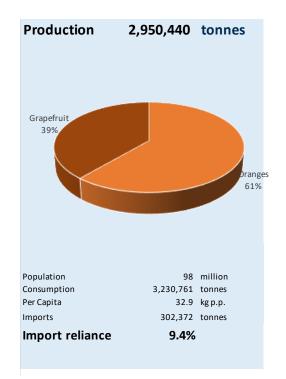

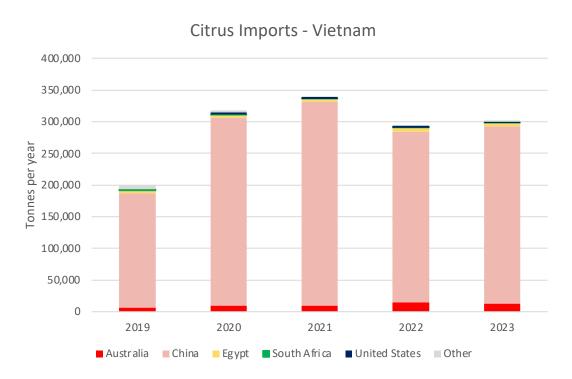

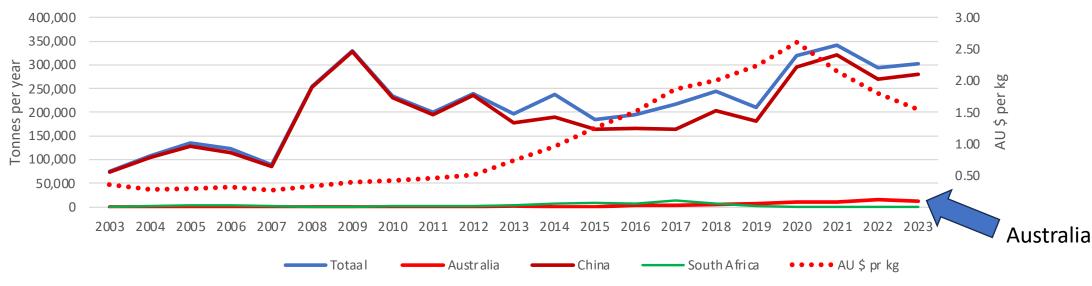
Significant producer of citrus – 2.9m tonnes 61 per cent is oranges 9.4% reliant on imports – mostly mandarins Imports are trending up 10 per cent per year 5 per cent from Southern Hemisphere Australia now is the only southern supplier

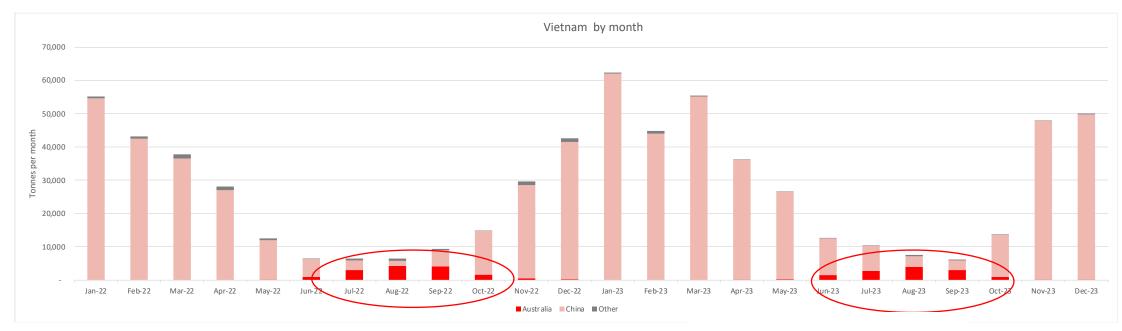


Dominated by mandarin imports from China Australia has effectively replaced South Africa Pricing records may not be realistic





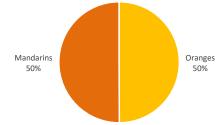
Vietnam - Seasonal citrus imports by supplier





China supplies of mandarins dominates almost all year round

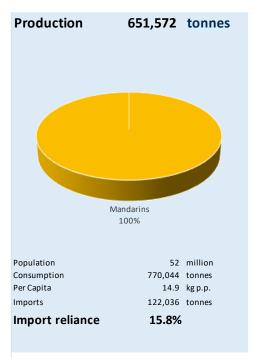
Australia is effectively the only southern supplier and the only supplier of oranges (50:50 oranges/ mandarins)

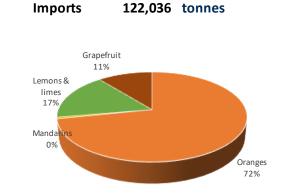






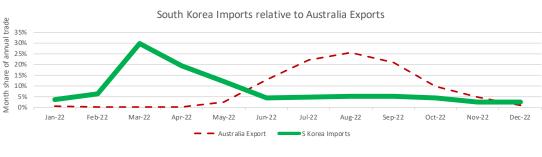

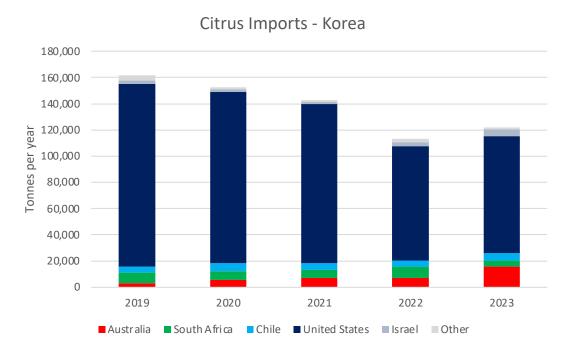

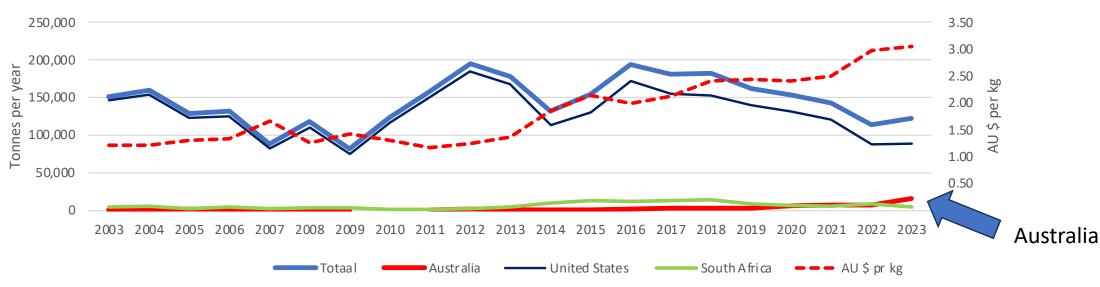
Moderate producer of citrus – 651k tonnes
100% are mandarins – highly protective
16% reliant on imports – mainly oranges
Imports are trending down 7 per cent per year
influenced by United States
17 per cent from Southern Hemisphere
13 per cent from Australia (up from 6% LY)

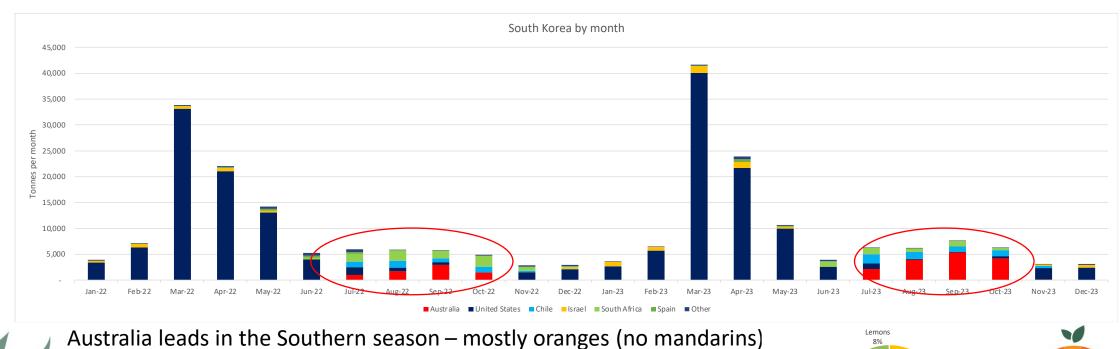


US imports are decreasing thus driving overall imports lower Australia now leads in the Southern season and exceeds South Africa Unit values are increasing





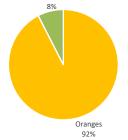
South Korea - Seasonal citrus imports by supplier

Australia leads - possibly even for lemons





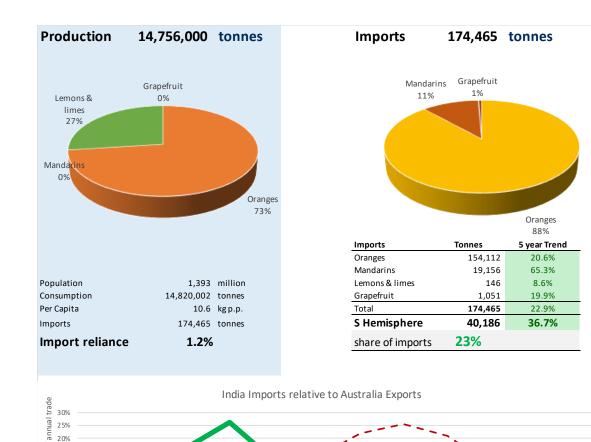

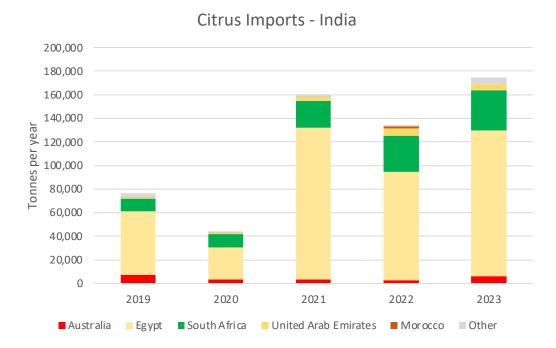

Large producer of citrus – 14.7m tonnes
73 per cent oranges
1.2% reliant on imports – mainly oranges
Imports are trending up 23 per cent per year
influenced by Egypt and South Africa
23 per cent from Southern Hemisphere
4 per cent from Australia (up from 2% LY)

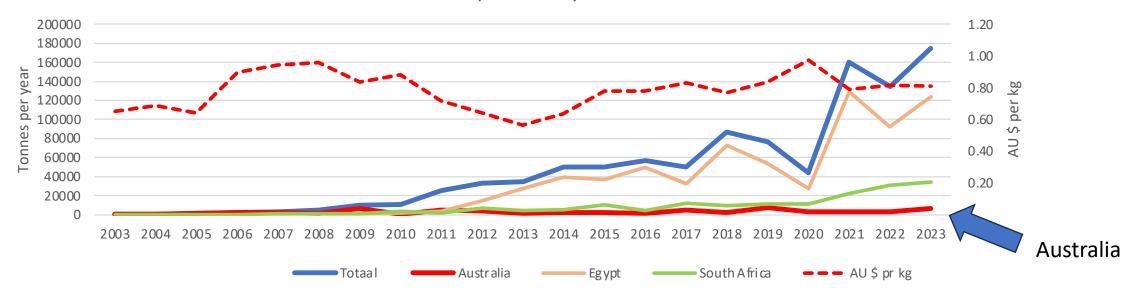

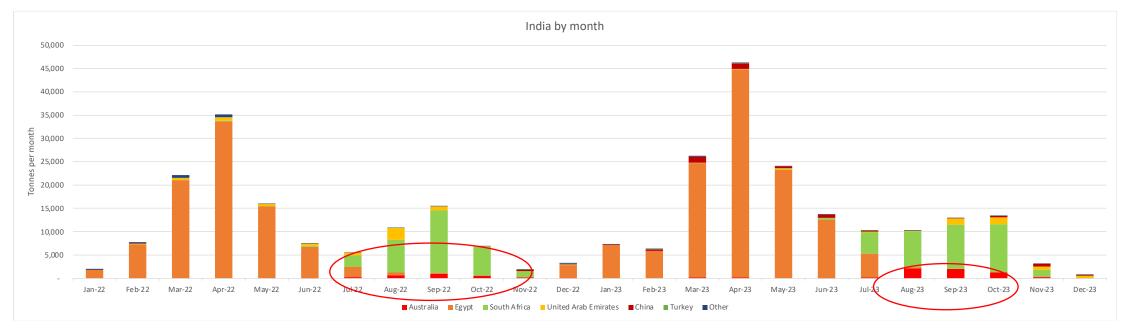


Import growth fueled from Egypt
South Africa is steadily increasing
Unit values are more or less around AU \$0.80c - exchange rates movements
Given high volume of local production India imports should target high quality





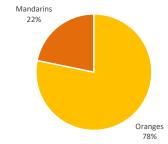
India - Seasonal citrus imports by supplier





Australia supplied 78% oranges and 22% mandarins Egypt dominates the import landscape from December to July with mainly oranges

Australia has increased market share from South Africa Aug – Oct





Discussion / Considerations

- Strategies for market growth enlarge the pie,
 - or larger slice of the pie?



- China larger slice of imports quality leadership advantage
- Vietnam enlarge the counter season, promote oranges
- South Korea enlarge the counter season for oranges, now on a new trajectory.
- India larger slice of counter season focus on quality advantage albeit low FOB price that could increase when product is better accepted
